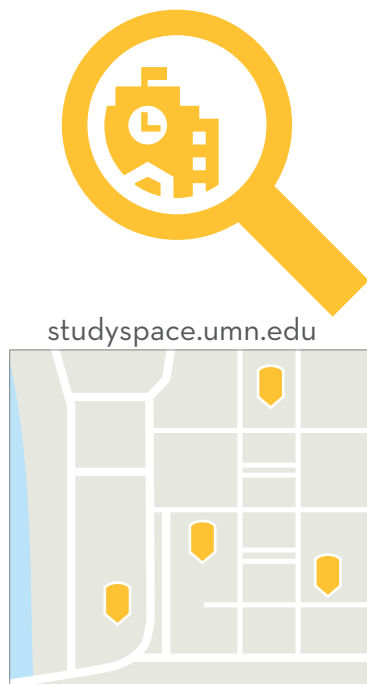

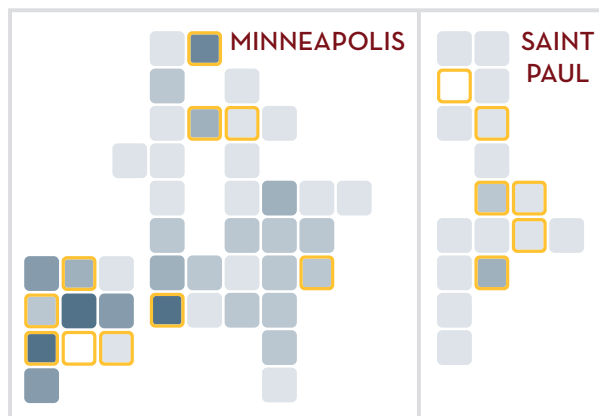


Tate Hall

The John T. Tate Hall renovation was a large, multi-million dollar project that involved many campus units and lasted from June 2015 to September 2017. All areas of OCM took part in the project. Among the many tasks that needed to be done, staff stayed on top of scheduling rooms, designing new audio and visual components, and delivering quality customer service and operations. In the building, we oversee 10 general purpose classrooms with a total capacity of 961 seats.

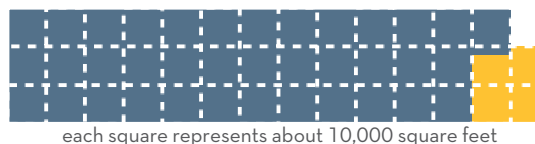

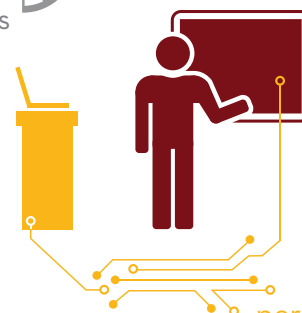

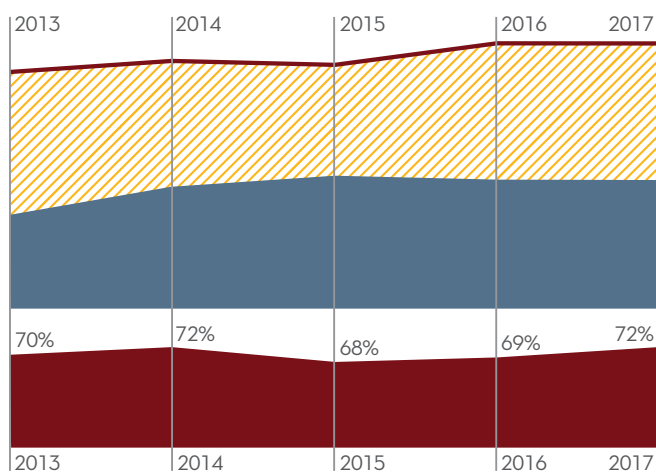
